I. Approval of Minutes: A motion to approve the September 2015 minutes was made by Mr. Graham, seconded by Ms. Cardinale and unanimously approved.

II. New Business:

• Nomination and Vote of 2016 Officers:

Chair: A nomination was made to elect Dr. Woodley as the Board of Health Chair for 2016, a motion was made by Mr. Graham to accept this nomination, and it was seconded by Dr. Tack and unanimously approved.

Vice Chair: A nomination was made to elect Dr. Delma as the Board of Health Vice-Chair for 2016, a motion was made by Mr. Graham to accept this nomination, and it was seconded by Dr. Woodley and unanimously

approved.

Secretary: A nomination was made to elect Ms. Hildebrandt as the Board of Health Secretary for 2016, a motion was made by Ms. Cardinale to accept this nomination, and it was seconded by Dr. Tack and unanimously approved. Ms. Hildebrandt was not at the meeting for this vote. The Commissioner's office will contact Ms. Hildebrandt to advise her of the Board's nomination and vote. Pending Ms. Hildebrandt's acceptance of the position, the Board's vote will stand.

- Board of Health Terms: The Board inquired as to the terms of the Board Members. The Commissioner's office reviewed each Board Member's terms.
- Board of Health Meeting Schedule: The proposed 2016 Board of Health Meeting Schedule was distributed and reviewed (see attached). A motion was made to accept the meeting schedule by Dr. Tack, seconded by Dr. Delma and unanimously approved.

III. Agency Reports:

b. Medical Examiner's Report:

- The monthly Medical Examiner's report was distributed and reviewed (see attached).
- A discussion ensued regarding the higher volume of Medical Examiner calls, autopsies and suicides as opposed to prior years. The Board was interested in identifying the resources available for suicide prevention. There was also a discussion about cases which involved a substance. Further discussion was tabled until the next meeting when the Commissioner was in attendance.

c. Patient Services Report:

- Influenza Surveillance NYS and UC:
 - The NYS Department of Health Weekly Influenza Surveillance Report was distributed and reviewed (see attached). To date there have been five (5) confirmed cases in Ulster County.
 - To date there are twenty-nine (29) out of thirty-four (34) Article 28 & 36 employees who have received their yearly flu vaccination. The status of five (5) employees is still pending.
- Physician Credentialing: Ms. Veytia reviewed the credentialing for Dr. Montera who provides STD treatment and HIV testing. NYS Article 28 Diagnostic and Treatment Center Policy require physicians providing medical treatment at a clinic, be a licensed physician with proof of current registration. A motioned was made by Mr. Graham to accept Dr. Montera for continued employment at the aforementioned clinics. Dr. Delma seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

d. Environmental Health Report:

- Sanitary Code Amendments: Ms. Mertens reviewed the proposed Sanitary Code Amendments with the Board (see attached). The Board recommended that Section 5.1.1, 3rd paragraph should read "For new construction only". A motion was made to accept and move forward with the amendments including the Board's recommendation by Dr. Tack, seconded by Mr. Graham and unanimously approved.
- Sanitary Code Next Steps: The Commissioner's Office will work the County Attorney's office to begin the next steps of the approval process for the Amendments.

Meeting Adjournment: A motion was made by Dr. Tack to adjourn the meeting; the motion was seconded by Dr. Delma and unanimously approved.

Next Meeting: The next meeting is scheduled for January 11, 2016.

Weekly Influenza Surveillance Report

The New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) collects, compiles, and analyzes information on influenza activity year round in New York State (NYS) and produces this weekly report during the influenza season (October through the following May).¹

During the week ending December 5, 2015


- Influenza activity level was categorized as geographically sporadic². Sporadic activity has been reported for nine
 consecutive weeks.
- There were 63 laboratory-confirmed influenza reports, a 7% increase over last week.
- Of the 1,135 specimens submitted to NYS WHO/NREVSS laboratories, 8 (0.70%) were positive for influenza.
- Of the 5 specimens submitted to Wadsworth Center, none were positive for influenza.
- Reports of percent of patient visits for influenza-like illness (ILI3) from ILINet providers was 1.64%, which is below the
 regional baseline of 2.3%.
- The number of patients hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed influenza was 23, a 5% increase over last week.
- There have been no influenza-associated pediatric deaths reported this season.

Laboratory Reports of Influenza (including NYC)

All clinical laboratories that perform testing on residents of NYS report all positive influenza test results to NYSDOH.

- 21 counties reported cases this week.
- Incidence ranged from 0.11-0.36 cases/100,000 population.

Note: Hamilton county's population is less than 5,000, therefore one positive case is equal to 21/100,000.

² No Activity: No laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza reported to the NYSDOH.

Sporadic: Small numbers of lab-confirmed cases of influenza reported.

Local: Increased or sustained numbers of lab-confirmed cases of influenza reported in a single region of New York State; sporadic in rest of state. Regional: Increased or sustained numbers of lab-confirmed cases of influenza reported in at least two regions but in fewer than 31 of 62 counties. Widespread: Increased or sustained numbers of lab-confirmed cases of influenza reported in greater than 31 of the 62 counties. Increased or sustained in defined as 2 or more cases of laboratory-confirmed influenza per 100,000 population.

3 |LI = influenza-like illness, defined as temperature 100° F with cough and/or sore throat in the absence of a known cause other than influenza

The following is a brief synopsis of the changes to the Sanitary Code by Article:

Article IV - Public Drinking Water Supplies

4.6.5 Removed payment of an application fee must be submitted, as required by the Commissioner/Director.

4.9.0 Removed the word natural.

Article V - Water Well Construction

5.1.1 Scope was added as discussed.

- 5.2.1 The definition of an Abandoned Well was left in the code as 5.6.0 was added to cover the abandonment of individual wells.
- 5.2.5 Definition of Individual Water Supply was added.
- 5.4.0 Construction Requirements was revised as discussed. The requirement to have the well driller registered by the Ulster County Department of Health was eliminated.
- 5.6.0 Abandonment of a water well was added to ensure that wells were abandoned in accordance with the NYSDOH requirements. The permitting requirements by UCDOH was however removed as discussed.

Article VI - Waste Facilities and Disposal

- 6.1.0 This section was modified to remove NYCDEP information.
- $6.2.12 \quad 100\%$ reserve area requirement was added.

Article VII - Realty Subdivisions

- 7.2.9 100% reserve area requirement was added.
- 7.2.13 The requirement to have a useable area of 12,500 square lot per foot was added.
