#### 1. Old Business

- a. Approval of Minutes: Approval of the minutes from the February 2022 meeting was tabled until the March meeting.
- b. Slate of Officers: A survey will be emailed to Members for nominations of 2022 Board Officers. Final vote will be made at the March meeting.
- c. Board of Health Meeting Schedule: A motion was made to approve the 2022 Board of Health Meeting Schedule by Ms. Turco, seconded by Dr. Carena and unanimously approved. Dr. Woodley stressed the importance of attending the monthly Board meetings.
- d. Board of Health Packet: Currently there is not a Board packet to be given to new members. A new member packet will begin to be established. It will include items such as Schedule of Meetings, Members and Terms, UC Charter as it applies to the Board of Health and other applicable documents.
- e. Board Candidates: New candidates will be sent the packet and invited to a Board meeting before deciding on applying to be a Board member. Dr Woodley will forward the CV of his candidate for Board review.

#### 2. Introductions

- a. The Board Members introduced themselves and Dr. Woodley welcomed Phil Erner to the Board meeting. Mr. Erner is and Ulster County Legislator for District 6 (City of Kingston). He also is a member of several Legislative subcommittees including the Health, Human Services and Housing subcommittee.
- 3. Commissioner's Update: Dr Smith reported on the following:
  - COVID Overview:
    - Reviewed the most recent COVID numbers (see attached).

- Dr. Smith pointed out that the numbers of positive cases are dropping. However, these numbers don't take into account those individuals who have tested positive via home test kit and have not reported it to DOH.
  - a. Mr. Erner inquired how the public can obtain COVID case information. Dr Smith said the UC COVID dashboard regularly contains this information. <a href="https://covid19.ulstercountyny.gov/dashboard">https://covid19.ulstercountyny.gov/dashboard</a>
  - b. Mr Erner asked about access for individuals without a computer. Dr. Smith said unfortunately a computer is needed to access.
  - c. Mr. Erner inquired about how the number of tests were calculate. Dr Smith explained it was from a combination of DOH tests given, Pharmacy numbers, other sites doing testing, medical offices, etc.
  - d. Mr Erner asked about the number of transferred out cases. There appears to be a data conflict. Dr Smith would investigate this with the data person who is responsible for collecting this information.
  - e. Mr Erner noted that some community members have expressed concern about the side effects from the vaccine. Dr. Smith explained that without knowing what those side effects are, she is unable to speak to the validity of their concern.
  - f. Vaccinations continue. PODs are still being hosted by the County. The numbers of individuals attending the PODs have greatly reduced and DOH has shortened the number of PODs and the length of time they are held. Home vaccinations are done upon request.

#### Medical Examiner (ME):

- a. The ME Report was distributed (see attached). Mr Erner observed that there are 3 times more male than female deaths. Dr. Smith added that is mainly white middle-aged males and are often involved in more of the violent deaths (MVA, Guns, etc).
- b. The Department needs more staffing help, especially now with the retirement of Dr. Heller, Medical Examiner.
  Currently, Dr Stutt is fulfilling the Medical Examiner role. However, it has left his Deputy ME position vacant. The Department is wanting to create a new

Medicolegal Investigator position equivalent to Haley Carr's. To date Dr. Smith has attended with the Deputy County Executive, Johanna Contreras three Legislative Committees to answer questions and explain the need for the position. She has attended Ways and Means, Health, Human Services and Planning and the Laws and Rules Committee. It continues to be a work in progress and Dr Smith will keep the Board apprised of the outcome.

c. Dr. Woodley confirmed that ME training will be built into the residence curriculum offered beginning July.

#### g. Department Personnel Update:

- a. Environment Division: With the Housing Market being high there has been an influx of plans to review and approve within the Environmental Division. The need to obtain more engineering help is crucial. There is a candidate being considered to hire as an Assistant Public Health Engineer to help with the review process.
- b. Patient Services: The division is struggling with their own staffing issues. Just recently there has been one employee resignation, one employee going out on maternity leave and another out on medical leave. The need for staff continues to be an issue.
- c. Offering comparable salaries with the private sector is always a challenge the Department is faced with.
- **6. Adjournment:** Motion to adjourn was not made but the meeting ended at 7:56 pm.
- 7. Next Meeting: Scheduled for Monday, March 14,2022 at 6:30 PM, via Zoom.
