Call To Order: 5:04PM. Dr. Woodley thanked the Board for their flexibility to meet virtually.

1. Commissioner's Update: Dr Smith reported on the following:

a. COVID Update:

- Reviewed the most recent COVID numbers (see attached).
- COVID is still a concern, accounting for 100,000 cases a day country wide. Dr. Smith strongly encouraged mask wearing in congregate settings.
- Continue to operate PODs every Saturday with additional pop-up PODs.
- There are current discussions happening regarding vaccinations for children 5 and under.

b. Other Communicable Disease Updates:

- Monkeypox Update: Seeing persistently increasing activity. NYS is #1 in states with active cases.

c. Medical Examiner Stats: The stats for the Medical Examiner's Office were distributed to the Board. (See Attached)

d. 2022 Department of Health Overview: Dr. Smith gave an overview of the Department of Health. She shared the 2021 Annual Report with the Board (See Attached). Some of the activities noted, but not nearly all, were water bacterial monitoring, response to water main breaks, food service, camps, pools, beaches, and temporary residences permitting. This also includes, but not limited to, ensuring compliance with the NYS and Ulster Sanitary Code, and dealing with those facilities who are non-compliant in efforts to bring the facility into compliance.

Dr. Smith thanked the Board and acknowledged all their support and work as members.

- 2. Institute of Family Health (IFH) Update:** Dr. Woodley gave an update on the activities of IFH. He stated that the mission of IFH is to provide services to all individuals without regard to race, gender, or ability to pay. The agency is vested in the health of the community. Their services are mainly in Ulster with 1 facility in Dutchess. The Port Ewen facility was recently closed. IFH will be opening a facility located on Pine St, Kingston by spring 2023. Dr. Sanchez will be the Medical Director of this site. This facility will offer a full scope of both mental health and family practice services-offering true community health.

IFH offers dental care at their Route 32 and Ellenville facilities. Dental services will not be at the Pine St site. Dr. Smith encouraged the reconsideration of this, as Pine St. is much more accessible to the community.

IFH offers COVID vaccinations through their EMR system. The request is put in the system to order the vaccine.

IFH offers residency training since 1981. This training is offered to 10 residents a year. To date, IFH has had approx. 147 graduates. Most graduates stay in the Hudson Valley.

Dr. Woodley acknowledged this was his last meeting as his term has ended. He thanked the County and stated that it was great to serve, he learned a lot and has a much broader understanding.

How We Serve

We offer a wide range of services and programs to Ulster County residents designed to prevent illness and ensure their physical, psychological, and emotional well-being. We are proud of our activities in regulating and monitoring community health, educating the public about health issues and concerns, and working with a broad spectrum of community partners to provide health and mental health programs and services that directly benefit the people of Ulster County. While we no longer provide mental health clinical services, we are committed to helping people connect to the services they need.

Overview of 2021

The year 2021 proved to be one of extraordinary challenges for our Department of Health and Mental Health. The ongoing presence of the COVID-19 pandemic in Ulster County demanded continuous monitoring of data, assessing of response efforts, flexibility in staffing management, extraordinary interdepartmental planning and cooperation, heightened resource management, and continuous problem solving and improvement of our collective response efforts. Since the first positive case of COVID in Ulster County in March of 2020, the virus has continued to spread throughout 2021 infecting individuals in every town and village. The availability of the vaccines produced by Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson and Johnson, brought hope that individuals would be able to avoid the severe consequences of COVID infection. Our Department of Health staff with the support of other County departments, the NYSDOH and many dedicated volunteers, continue to battle the disease through ongoing vaccination PODs, community outreach and education, and heroic commitment to the mission of Public Health.
