Business Description

Dimples is a Midtown-Kingston women's boutique specializing in creating hairpieces and hair styling for women of color. The business plans to expand its offers to create wigs for those who lose their hair to illness or congenital conditions. The business reduced employment by at least one full-time equivalent (FTE) position during any quarter of 2020. The business reduced its operating hours for at least four consecutive weeks during the period March 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021, or otherwise substantially changed its business operations due to COVID-19 during that period.

Use of Funds

Business inventory expenses, has been unable to fully stock store due to financial strain from COVID. Business also plans to hire new part-time employees to expand hours.

CDBG Underwriting

Project Costs – Applicant will use grant funds for inventory, furniture, fixtures, marketing expenses, and payroll to be incurred within 120 days of grant agreement execution. Documentation of business-related costs will be required prior to disbursement and must be eligible and reasonable.

Commitment of Other Sources of Funds – None required

No Substitution of CDBG Funds for Non-Federal Funds – There are no other non-federal grant sources available to assist in post-COVID business restoration costs.

Financial Feasibility – The company closed completely for three months due to COVID. Business is a hair salon that also provides hairpieces and wigs, and during COVID people were not utilizing hair salons due to health fears as well as lack of social opportunities. The business will bolster its long-term stability by creating another revenue stream and creating hair pieces/wigs designed for cancer patients. CDBG grant funds will allow business to regain capacity to serve original clientele as well as expand to new client base that will help offset continuing COVID volatility. The business has been in operation for 17 years.

Reasonable Return on Equity – There is nothing in the company's historical operating performance that suggests that the proposed grant would produce an unreasonable return on equity or result in profitability substantially in excess of industry standards.

Pro Rata Disbursement of CDBG Funds – No matching funds are required. Documentation of all project expenditures will be required prior to the disbursement of CDBG funds.

Connection to Coronavirus

Per Ulster County's application to the CDBG-CV program, the proposed project meets the following program goals:

- Support of Sole proprietor business that meets LMI qualifications
- Investment in marketing plan to grow business
- Investment in re-alignment of business to increase stability during continuing COVID reality

Recommendation

Applicant can be conditionally approved for a grant of up to \$35,000 based on being a Microenterprise with a low-moderate income owner. Based on eligible expenses, the maximum allowable grant award could be \$29,300.
