### Applicant

Emily Kerr-Finnell and Etan Kerr-Finnell (100% owners)

Wholesale In a Box has worked with more than 1000 makers, artists and designers around the world. The business experienced at least a 1% reduction in net profit from tax year 2019 to tax year 2020 as evidenced by federal income tax returns.

## Use of Funds

Business-related payments for payroll, childcare (while owner works), marketing, Internet, utilities, necessary software, and business management tools costs. All costs to be purchased/incurred within 120 days of award.

#### **CDBG Underwriting**

**Project Costs** – Applicant will use grant funds for payroll, childcare (while owner works), marketing, Internet, utilities, necessary software, and business management tools costs expenses to be incurred within 120 days of grant agreement execution.

Documentation of business-related costs will be required prior to disbursement and must be eligible and reasonable.

*Commitment of Other Sources of Funds* – None required, but applicant is committing \$15,895 of their own funds.

*No Substitution of CDBG Funds for Non-Federal Funds* – There are no other non-federal grant sources available to assist in post-COVID business restoration costs.

**Financial Feasibility** – The company is a training and software company that serves small product companies and helps them grow their businesses. In Feb 2020, they had 3 employees, working close to 30 hours each. However, because the company serves small businesses (who were impacted by Covid's effect on their sales), revenues dropped dramatically, and customer base declined. Due to that decline 2 of 3 employees were laid off. Today they are operating with just one employee and have recently had to reduce her hours from 40 hours per week to just 20 hours per week. CDBG grant funds will allow business to regain capacity to serve clients through continuing COVID volatility.

**Reasonable Return on Equity** – There is nothing in the company's historical operating performance that suggests that the proposed grant would produce an unreasonable return on equity or result in profitability substantially in excess of industry standards.

**Pro Rata Disbursement of CDBG Funds** – No matching funds are required, but the \$15,000 of own funds committed. Documentation of all project expenditures will be required prior to the disbursement of CDBG funds.

#### Connection to Coronavirus

Per Ulster County's application to the CDBG-CV program, the proposed project meets the following program goals:

- Support of business that meets LMI qualifications
- Investment in marketing plan to grow business
- Expenses related to increasing hours that were cut due to COVID's impact on business.

#### **Recommendation**

Applicant can be conditionally approved for a grant of up to \$35,000 based on being a Microenterprise with two low-moderate income owners. Based on eligible expenses, the maximum allowable grant award could be \$34755
