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Executive Summary

Executive Summary

The purpose of the benchmark analysis report was to assist UCEDA in understanding certain activity as requested by UCEDA as it pertains to identified peer organizations. In response to a request by UCEDA, we performed benchmarking analysis of similar organizations for counties with populations between 150,000 and 250,000. Utilizing publicly available PARIS filings, New York State Open Book reporting, information obtained from the peers' websites and other sources, we compared them to the following similar authorities:

- o Broome County Local Development Corporation (BCLDC)
- Broome County Industrial Development Agency (BCIDA)
- Rensselaer County Industrial Development Agency (RCIDA)
- Oneida County Industrial Development Agency (OCIDA)
- Schenectady County Industrial Development Agency (SCIDA)

This comparative analysis focused on five major areas:

Staffing

UCEDA reported 9 full-time staff, though all were employed and paid by Ulster County. This is higher than the peer average of 5.8 total staff (3.8 FT, 2 PT). Adjusting for time actually dedicated to UCEDA-specific activities suggests that the staffing is within an appropriate range (3–5 FTE), consistent with peer expectations.

Operating Budget

UCEDA's operating budget is below the peer group average in both income and expenses. Total budgeted income was approximately \$195K compared to a peer average of \$210K, indicating appropriate scale for its scope of services.

Revenue Mix

UCEDA's revenue stream, excluding the previous COVID grants, of rental and financing income and charges for services was similar to most peers. We observed a possible opportunity for UCEDA to reevaluate its fee structure for services to align more closely with peer norms and enhance sustainability.

Project Duration ("Shelf Life")

Peer project durations typically range from short-term (construction periods of several months) to long-term (20–22 years) for projects under PILOT or bond agreements. Examples include the Bluestone Wind project (Broome IDA, 20 years), Yates Village II (Schenectady IDA, 22 years), and the Troy Record redevelopment (Rensselaer IDA, 20 years). These project lifespans illustrate that while durations vary widely, long-term engagements are common and should inform UCEDA's project planning horizon.

Services Offered

UCEDA's services, including property development and loan financing, align with core services offered by peers. While other peers provide workforce development or PILOT/mortgage tax exemptions, those services are typically managed by IDA or LDC partners within the county, not by UCEDA itself. Thus, UCEDA's current structure and offerings are appropriate given its role in the broader county economic development ecosystem.

Conclusion

UCEDA's operations are generally consistent with peer expectations. Some opportunities exist to further align staffing levels to actual workloads, reexamine revenue strategies, and explore efficiencies through service integration or enhanced fee structures. These insights should assist UCEDA leadership in prioritizing resources and setting strategic goals.

Benchmarking Analysis

Observations

Staffing. UCEDA's staffing levels are relatively consistent with its peer group, based on the most recent PARIS filings. However, two factors should be considered in this analysis:

- The most recent PARIS filing for UCEDA was 2023 and many of the staff listed have changed.
- All staff listed in the UCEDA 2024 PARIS filing were noted as FT and paid by another local government (the County). While their overall roles including the County may be FT, the amount of time allotted for UCEDA is not actually considered FT.

The takeaway from these number is that UCEDA's peers average approximately 5 FTE (4 FT and 2 PT). Based upon the activities undertaken currently by UCEDA and current and potential outsourcing opportunities, staffing at the 3-5 FTE appears appropriate for UCEDA.

Operating Budget Size. In our analysis below, UCEDA's budgeted revenues and expenses are well below the peer group. However, Broome and Rensselaer IDAs are much larger than the other peers due primarily to additional service offerings as discussed in the service offering section of this report. We provided additional analysis below that excludes those entities and the analysis shows that UCEDA is much more in line with the similar peers.

Revenue Sources. The analysis below points out that, other than Broome County LDC, each of the peers share similar types of revenues as UCEDA. However, UCEDA and the other peers share the distinction that the volume and number of transactions from year to year may change as the projects that are administered are constantly changing. That is why a trend analysis for UCEDA or peer analysis may not be as comparable and yield as meaningful results. The Revenue mix analysis below provides a better picture as it demonstrates the mix which may stay more constant despite growth or contraction. The variance in Fees for Services from its peers may indicate that UCEDA should consider rate adjustments for future projects. We also noted that the federal and state revenue is an outlier as that pertained to COVID related grants and only Broome LDC administered similar projects. Most similar entities administer these within their county.



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Project Shelf. Determining the average project length for economic development entities such as the Ulster County Economic Development Alliance (UCEDA) and similar organizations in New York State can be challenging due to the variability in project scopes, sectors, and funding structures. However, available data and examples provide some insights for some of the peer organizations:

Broome County IDA / LDC

The Broome County Industrial Development Agency (The Agency) supports various economic development projects. For instance, the Bluestone Wind LLC project was approved for a 20-year Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) agreement, aligning with the typical lifespan of wind turbines. This indicates that some projects under The Agency's purview are long-term, spanning two decades.

Schenectady County IDA

The City of Schenectady IDA approved the Yates Village II LLC project, which includes financial assistance planned to end in 2042. This suggests a project duration of approximately 22 years, reflecting the long-term nature of certain development initiatives.

Rensselaer County IDA

In 2015, the Rensselaer County IDA approved a 20-year PILOT agreement for the redevelopment of the former Troy Record building. This example illustrates that projects facilitated by the Rensselaer County IDA can also span two decades.

Oneida County IDA

The Oneida County Industrial Development Agency (OCIDA) offers financial incentives and growth opportunities to businesses. Specific project durations are not detailed publicly, but given the nature of industrial development projects, durations can range from short-term construction phases to long-term operational periods.

Statewide Guidance and Reporting

New York State mandates that Industrial Development Agencies (IDAs) comply with reporting requirements, including the submission of annual compliance reports and documentation of sales tax exemptions. These reports provide transparency and accountability for the duration and impact of economic development projects. We have included the most recent filed PARIS reporting at the end of this report which includes detailed reporting on each project for the peer organizations.

Summary

While specific average project lengths are not uniformly reported across all economic development entities, available examples indicate that project durations can vary significantly, ranging from short-term (e.g., 120 days) to long-term (e.g., 20-22 years), depending on the project's nature and objectives.

Resources Offered

Based upon an analysis of each peers' website and annual reports, we compiled the types of services provided by each peer organization in the table below. Our analysis indicates that UCEDA's activities relating to properties for sale, lease and development as well as loan financing are consistent with its peers. The other services provided by the peer organizations are typical for LDC and IDAs, but not something that would typically be included in an organization such as UCEDA as the County also has an IDA and LDC to administer those type of programs.

Conclusions

Overall, UCEDA's operations are aligned with its peer group in terms of staffing, budget, and services offered. While certain areas may exhibit higher revenues, expenses and service offerings, these appear justified given the organization's revenue streams and service quality. UCEDA may benefit from periodic reviews of program offerings, and rate reviews to ensure continued fiscal efficiency. Additionally, staffing structure should be considered and a determination of whether to continue with shared staffing or outsourcing some functions.
